## 2020 Fourth Quarter Arrests and Diversions




The following document presents an analysis of LEAD diversions and arrests in October, November, and December of 2020; this data is extracted from the APD Record Management System and LEAD documentation.

Charts 1a shows the total number of LEAD diversions (6), by race and gender, made by the Albany Police Department in the fourth quarter of 2020. Additionally, charts 1b shows the total number of arrests (487), by race and gender, excluding diversions made by the Albany Police Department in 2020.

## 1A LEAD DIVERSIONS BY GENDER






