Council President Kimbrough led the Council in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and requested a moment of silence.

The proceedings of the meeting are as follows:

- Tom Ellis, Albany, NY – Spoke on concerns about the structural stability of multi-floor buildings, supported the Tudor Historic District, and asked for improved crosswalk maintenance

There being no further speakers, Council President Kimbrough declared the Public Comment Period closed.

Consideration of Resolutions

President Pro Tempore Election

Council Member Anane moved to nominate Council Member Farrell as President Pro Tempore; the motion was seconded by Council Member Zamer and passed by voice vote.

Majority Leader Election

Council Member Keegan moved to nominate Council Member Balarin as Majority Leader; the motion was seconded by Council Member Brodie.

Council Member Adams moved to nominate Council Member Johnson as Majority Leader; the motion was seconded by Council Member Hoey.

Discussion was held regarding the nominations to the position of Majority Leader.

- Council Member Balarin discussed his qualifications for serving as Majority Leader.
- Council Member Johnson discussed his qualifications for serving as Majority Leader.
- Research Counsel Robert Wenner clarified the procedure for voting on a Majority Leader.

There being no further discussion, Council President Kimbrough called for a vote on the motion to nominate Council Member Balarin as Majority Leader; and the appointment of Council Member Balarin to the position of Majority Leader was approved.

President Pro Tempore Farrell moved designate the Albany Times Union as the Official Newspaper of the City of Albany; the motion was seconded by Council Member Hoey and passed by voice vote.
