

\$25,000,000: American Rescue Plan

PRESIDENT BIDEN'S PLAN TO PROVIDE DIRECT RELIEF TO AMERICANS, CONTAIN COVID-19, AND RESCUE THE ECONOMY

Millions of American workers reside in communities that suffered disproportionately during the pandemic. The American Rescue Plan, signed March 11, 2021, provides critical support to these communities. ARPA includes \$350 billion in direct aid for cities and states to assist with their recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, of which the City of Albany has received \$81 million. \$25 million of this was made available to organizations, including City of Albany departments, to fund local projects and programs that will support Albany's recovery and future progress.

In January 2022, Mayor Sheehan announced the allocation of \$25 million to nonprofits, businesses, residents, and City departments.



President Joe Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) into law on March 11, 2021. ARPA includes \$350 billion in direct aid for cities and states to assist with their recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. The City of Albany received \$81 million and made \$25 million of these funds available to organizations, including City of Albany departments, to fund local projects and programs that will support Albany's recovery and future progress - an initiative called "Albany for All".

The "Albany for All" initiative is aimed at revitalizing Albany through 35 hand-selected projects.

These projects include investments in affordable housing, community spaces, arts, tourism, small businesses, and workforce development. The tagline "powered by pride and potential" highlights the City's attributes and encourages active community participation. Emphasizing inclusivity, the campaign calls on both long-time residents and newer residents to join forces in shaping Albany's future. It serves as a rallying cry for civic pride, uniting various sectors to harness human capital and drive transformative change. "Albany for All" embodies an energy of resilience and determination to create a stronger and brighter future for our city.
