

Eileen Larrabee is Senior Vice President for Communications for the Open Space Institute (OSI), a national conservation leader which has protected more than 2.3 million acres of land throughout the eastern United States and southern Canada. She has more than 30 years of experience in public affairs and strategic communications, working in both the public and not-for-profit sectors. In her current role at OSI, Larrabee oversees strategic communications, publications, media relations, and digital/social media platforms. As a member of senior staff, she collaborates on OSI projects and methods, as well as public and community relations. In addition to her communications portfolio, Larrabee serves as a senior advisor to OSI's parks and policy program.

Prior to her tenure at OSI, Larrabee served as Director of Public Information for the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation. In this executive staff position, she managed communications for a system of 213 state parks and historic sites, guided public affairs, and played a key advisory role for the commissioner and administration officials.

Before joining State Parks, Larrabee worked for 16 years in the New York State Assembly, the last eight years of which were spent as Assistant Press Secretary in the Assembly Majority Press Office. Larrabee earned a BA in American Studies from St. John's University and a MA in Political Science from the Rockefeller Institute of Public Affairs and Policy at the State University of New York at Albany.
